These include Project Plug-IN, a large-scale demonstration of electric vehicle and smart grid alignment in the Indianapolis region; the Hoosier Heavy Hybrid Partnership, a coalition of companies focused on the development of medium- and heavy-duty hybrid electric trucks; and Micro-Green, the development of a microgrid system capable of delivering renewable energy to military bases and commercial energy users.
