
Stonybrook will host a Buy One-Get One Free book fair in the LGI room from May 6-10.

May is Healthy Vision Month!

It's important to take care of your eyes. Poor vision makes it harder to read, drive, and cook. The good news: Many eye problems and diseases can be treated if caught early. To make sure you keep seeing clearly, get a comprehensive dilated eye exam.

Signs that parents should look for:

- Bumping into furniture or walls.
- Losing balance when standing up from a sitting position.
- Holding objects close to their nose to see.
- Rubbing eyes a lot.
- Squinting frequently.
- Using only one eye and covering the other.
- Not focusing the eyes together; e.g., one eye is looking left and the other is looking right, or one eye is looking up and the other is looking down.

Nine Ways to Help Protect Your Vision

The best option is to keep your eyes as healthy as possible throughout your lifetime.

- Get a dilated eye exam.
- Know your family's eye health history.
- Eat right to protect your sight—in particular, eat plenty of dark leafy greens such as spinach, kale, or collard greens, and fish that is high in omega-3 fatty acids.
- Maintain a healthy weight.
- Wear protective eyewear when playing sports or doing activities around the home.
- Quit smoking or never start.
- Wear sunglasses that block 99%-100% of UVA and UVB radiation.
- Clean your hands and your contact lenses properly to avoid the risk of infection.
- Practice workplace eye safety.

Race to the Top . . . \$28.5 million

As you may know, Warren Township was recently awarded a federal Race to the Top grant for more than \$28.5 million to be spent over the next four years! Through three specific Projects, this additional funding will help Warren increase student achievement, provide greater opportunities for personalized learning, and ensure students' readiness for post-secondary college and career opportunities. Please read about Project 1 below, and watch for information about Projects 2 and 3 in upcoming newsletters.

Under Project 1, Warren will work with national experts to align our K-12 curriculum to Common Core State Standards. This new, rigorous curriculum will be supported by an increase in technology used in your student's school and classroom. Every student in 1st through 12th grade will have a laptop to use during the school day. Warren is the first school district in Marion County to provide this opportunity to students! Kindergarten students will also have access to iPads in their classrooms. High-tech learning environments called Mediaplexes will be constructed at Creston, Raymond Park, and Stonybrook for use by 5th through 8th grade students. These Mediaplexes will be similar to the one constructed at Warren Central High School last year, and will be outfitted with computers, document cameras, and distance learning equipment to connect Warren students to learning opportunities all around the world! At WCHS, approximately 75 classrooms are being renovated to include ceiling mounted projectors and dry erase walls to encourage creativity and collaboration among students. Additionally, construction is taking place to make WCHS a completely wireless school!
